Cedar Run cares for thousands of animals each year, including more than 60 resident animals who are unable to be returned to the wild. These animals, known as our Wildlife Ambassadors, are given a second chance at life through our education programs. Your support provides food, shelter and medical care for the sponsored animal and helps provide care for the nearly 5,000 wild animals admitted to the Wildlife Hospital each year.

Many of these animals travel with our education team, visiting almost 300 schools and teaching over 30,000 students annually about conservation, wildlife, and environmental stewardship. By choosing a sponsorship adoption for your class, you'll be able to share the fascinating world of our education wildlife ambassadors with your students year round! Periodic e-mail updates about the chosen ambassador can be read aloud to classes, shared on a Smart Board, or printed for short activity reading time. The updates will include a short passage about an exciting venture your chosen ambassador has been up to! If your class chooses an ambassador that's on our traveling education team, you can request this animal, availability allowing, for your in-class or on-site programs with Cedar Run Wildlife Refuge, too!

Grades preschool - 2
